YOUNG LEADER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



STATE UPDATES



KANSAS - "There are a couple of things in Kansas related to agricultural chemicals," reports Randy Stookey, JD, Sr. VP, General Counsel, Kansas Agribusiness Retailers Association (KARA). First, the Pesticide Waste Disposal Program.

This week, the House Committee on Agriculture held a hearing on House Bill 2432. The bill amends the agricultural chemical remediation fund to allow up to \$50,000 from the fund each year to be used to fund a Pesticide Waste Disposal Program managed by the Kansas Dept. of Agriculture. The agricultural chemical remediation fund is funded, in part, by annual agricultural chemical product registration fees. Kansas Agribusiness Retailers Association views this program as good industry stewardship and supports the measure.

The second issue is the Kansas Attorney General "Public Litigation Coordination Act." This week, the House Judiciary Committee held a hearing on House Bill 2461, a bill requested by Kansas Attorney General Derek Schmidt. The bill would require local units of government to coordinate with the Attorney General before entering into a contract for legal services on a contingency fee basis. The bill would allow for the state to exercise greater control over large product litigation suits where both the state and local units of government may become plaintiffs, rather than allowing each subordinate unit of government to enter into independent lawsuits. The bill represents good public policy for both the state and for the agricultural industry in that product litigation law would now be consolidated into one action at the state level, rather than hundreds of individual suits within the state.



MINNESOTA - "The Minnesota legislature convenes for 2020 on February 11 for the regular session which will meet through mid May," stated Bill Bond, Executive Director, Minnesota Crop Production Retailers. However, a pre-session meeting was held by the MN House Agriculture and Food Finance and Policy Division and focused on responding to a changing climate: Agriculture best practices and what is being done. A joint presentation was made by MN Department of Agriculture, MN Board of Soil and Water Resources, and MN Pollution Control

Agency, and committee members reviewed an optional soil sample demonstration, looked more specifically at alternatives for moving forward by discussing a research update by University of Minnesota Extension, and finally evaluated how farmers are looking at new practices to adapt to challenges associated with and contribute to solutions to a changing climate.



WISCONSIN - "In 2019, the Assembly Speaker set up a bipartisan Speaker's Task Force on Water Quality," says Tom Bressner, Executive Director, Wisconsin Agri-Business Association. After many hearings around the state and lots of input, the Task Force has proposed numerous bills to help address the issues. These bills are just beginning to work their way through committee work. Some of the recommendations will most likely become law, others will not. Currently, we do not see anything being proposed that will be a major issue for agronomy

companies. This story will be continued for several more weeks.

In the Governor's State of the State Address last week, he announced several new initiatives to help with challenging economic times for farmers. Some of the ideas are good and will probably get implemented. However, his proposals call for additional spending of \$8.6 million and the creation of 35 new jobs. A conservative Republican controlled legislature will not approve that much growth of government and governmental spending. This too will be interesting to monitor in the coming days.
