Maddie Smith, University of Minnesota



Abby Bertz, University of Missouri - Columbia Abby was selected to be the talent emcee for Mizzou's 2020 Homecoming.




Lily Woitaszewski, University of Nebraska - Lincoln Lily enjoys spending time helping her family with their cow and calf operation.

 decision in National Farm Family Coalition, et al. v. U.S. EPA regarding EPA's
 registration of Enlist Duo. The Ninth Circuit decision to uphold the registration
 of Enlist Duo, while the EPA addresses the additional documentation required
 by the Court means the registration of Enlist Duo remains in place and the
 product can continue to be sold and applied by farmers while the EPA
 performs this work.
